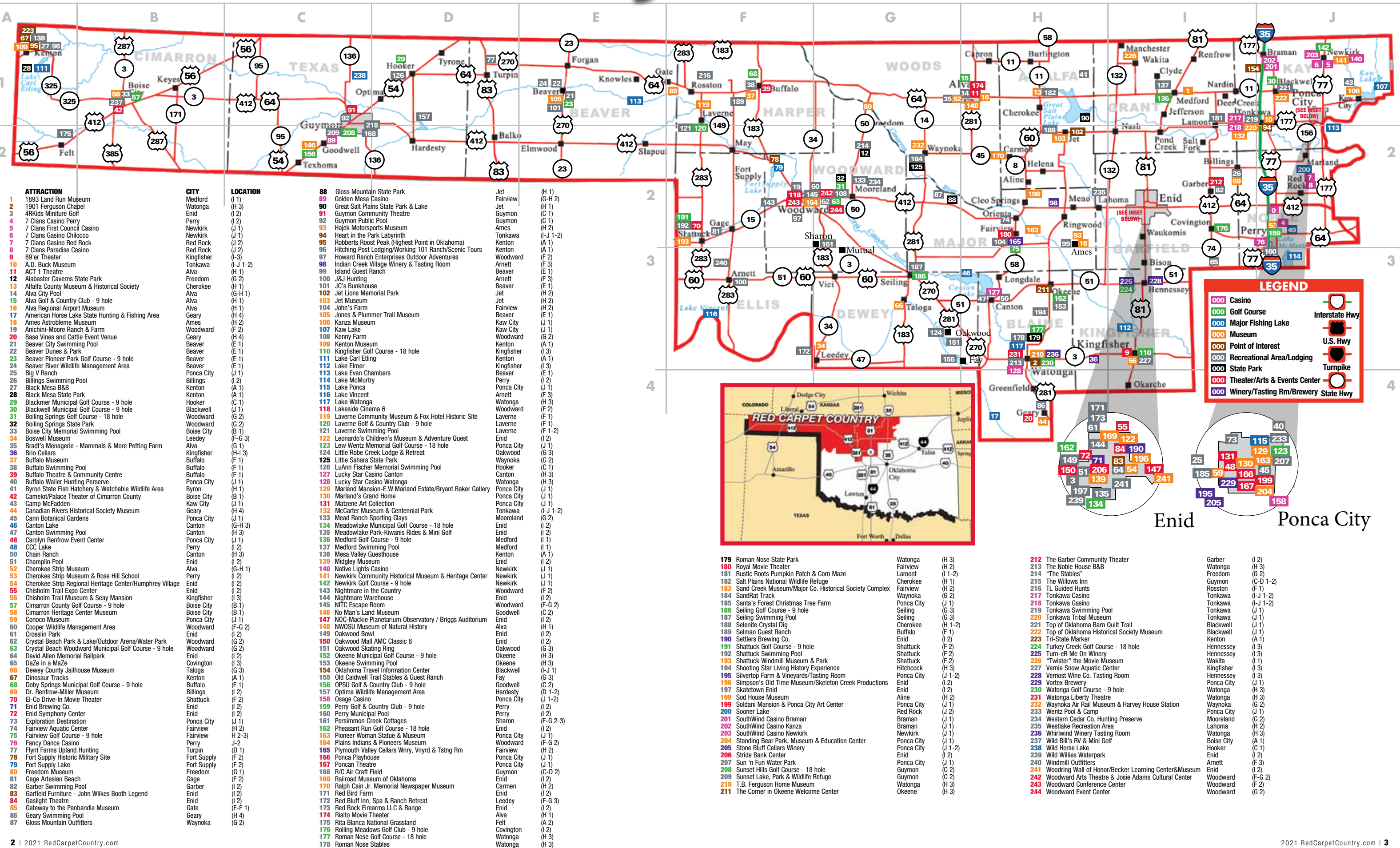

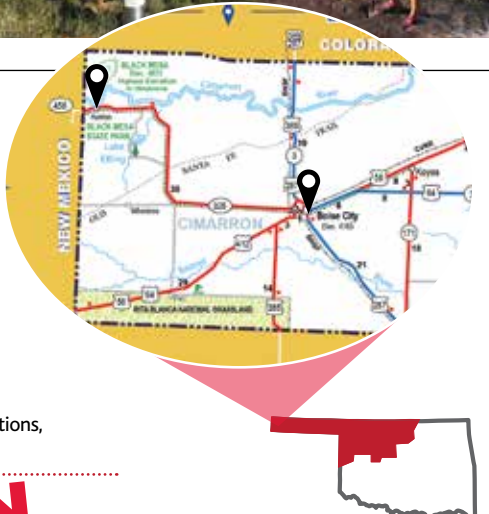

■ BOISE CITY (Cimarron County)

Boise City is renowned as the only continental U.S. town "bombed" during World War II. Boise City is home to the historic Cimarron County Courthouse encircled by a roundabout. It offers lodging, dining, and shopping at unique boutiques like Willow Way. Don't miss Autograph Rock, it is truly a treasure and a must see.

Boise City is home to the Cimarron Heritage Center Museum, one of the best local museums in Northwest Oklahoma. The museum features the Dust Bowl Era, the Santa Fe Trail, local history, and a one-of-a-kind dinosaur exhibit.

Motorcycle enthusiasts from around the country ride through this area on the cross-country Trans American Trail (TAT). Boise City also offers swimming, a golf course and miniature golf.

HOOKER (Texas County)

Hooker hosts one of the largest car shows in Oklahoma. Hooker is located near the center of the Oklahoma Panhandle along U.S. Highway 54, and is the second largest community in Texas County. The town is home to many events and festivals. The Annual Hooker Car Show is the Saturday after Labor Day. They have an annual Easter Egg Hunt, Halloween parade, Christmas parade, and on Independence Day they host Hot Dogs in the Park.

GUYMON (Texas County)

Guymon is the melting pot of culture, arts, festivals, and hospitality for travelers. It's rich in Pioneer history, Western panoramas and diversity with over 25 dialects spoken in the community. Guymon is home to the Rodeo Hall of Fame PRCA's Pioneer Days Rodeo, an annual Fiesta Day event, and the Five State Motorcycle Run.

Guymon's Downtown Cultural Arts District offers an arts center, community theatre, historic sites, art studios, dining, shopping, and more. The stocked Sunset Lake is adjacent to the Wildlife Refuge's bison, Texas longhorns, and elk. Sunset Hills 18-hole golf course carries a USGA 69 rating with a slope of 117 and is a junior golf national automatic exemption site. Guymon also has a disc golf course, R/C air craft field, walking trails, and parks.

Goodwell is home to Oklahoma Panhandle State University. Visit the campus to enjoy a football or soccer game at the Anchor D Stadium, and to watch a basketball game or volleyball match at the Oscar Williams Field House.

You will find the No Man's Land Museum in Goodwell. The museum houses many artifacts from the ranchers and

homesteaders of the era. The founders of the No Man's Land Museum were pre-territorial pioneers who wanted to preserve the unique history of their community. Museum exhibits include a two-headed calf, dinosaur footprints, pre-historic mastodon and mammoth bones.

There are 520 acres of dune buggy rides on 300 acres of sand hills.

While in Beaver, enjoy the city pool, golf course, shopping, dining, and the wildlife management area. Relax at JC's Bunkhouse and experience the ice cream shop. Take time to explore the Jones & Plummer Trail Museum and do some fishing at Lake Evan Chambers.

The Town of Buffalo is centrally located in Harper County. Buffalo hosts "July 4th Celebration in the Park", an event for the whole family, offering softball tournament, entertainment, free food, and a wondrous display of fireworks closes the day. The Harper County Round-up Club hosts a variety of events throughout the summer to showcase the youth. Buffalo is home to many events and programs, such as Red Rock Flea Market, Old Settlers Picnic, Stone City Park Christmas Display, Crafters Christmas Mall, and Santa Day.

Play a round of golf at the Laverne Golf Course, take advantage of the wonderful hunting opportunities in the area, including many OLAP (Oklahoma Land Acquisition Program) areas open to

public hunting. Dine at one of the locally owned restaurants, swing by for a dip in the city pool, enjoy the barn quilt displays on the official Barn Quilt Tour, and stretch your legs on the 3-mile recreation trail.

Known far and wide for the 4th of July Celebration, Laverne hosts the true All-American Independence Day event complete with a large parade, turtle races, volleyball and basketball tournaments, mud run, "Duck Race", softball games, free food, entertainment, homemade ice cream and an amazing fireworks display.

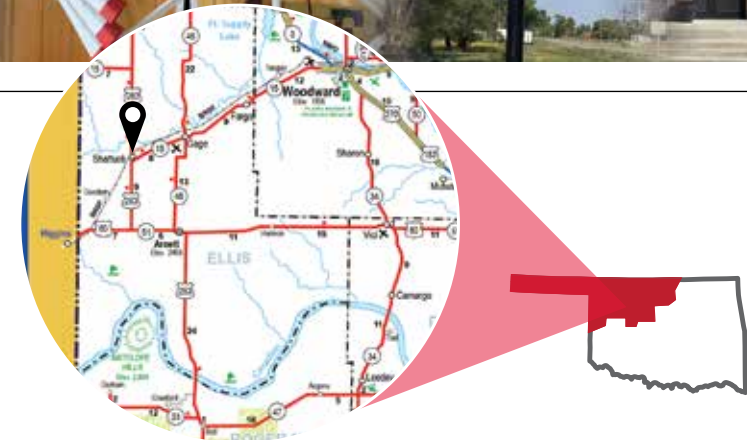
SHATTUCK (Ellis County)

Shattuck is the largest city in Ellis County. The well-maintained city golf course is a favorite for area corporate tournaments and features a weekly open scramble. City Park has all new playground equipment, a large public pool, tennis courts and a new covered picnic facility. Enjoy a nature walk or run at Centennial Lake's lighted walking trail. The Ellis County area offers hunting and fishing opportunities.

The Stuart Memorial building is listed on the National Historic Register and houses the Shattuck Public Library. The walls in the enormous brick structure display murals depicting the history of Shattuck. The Newman Memorial Hospital, established in 1920, has offered rural Northwest Oklahoma almost a century of exceptional care. In 2010, Newman Memorial completed a 5-million-dollar renovation. The life and legacy of founding pioneer physician, O.C. Newman is detailed in the popular novel "Hang on to the Willows."

WOODWARD (Woodward County)

Originally home to Kiowa, Cheyenne, Comanche & Arapahoe tribes, Woodward was established in 1887, when the railroad arrived, and became a stop along the Great Western Cattle Trail. The depot shipped thousands of cattle East and Woodward got a reputation as a rough-and-tumble frontier town. Located in the western quadrant of the Cherokee Outlet, the town began six years before the outlet was officially opened to non-Indian settlers. It operated as a provisioning point for Fort Supply. The Fort Supply Historic Site was home to the original 19th Century Army camp where General George Custer based his troops during the U.S. Government's campaign against the Plains Indians. In November 1956, Woodward began a new adventure – oil and gas production; McCormick #1 became the country's discovery gas well.

Boiling Springs State Park, a natural 'oasis on the plains' was one of the original seven State Parks of the 1930's.

The park is named after the natural 'boiling' spring that still flows and the golf course provides a challenging playing experience.

Woodward showcases the enduring pioneer spirit with genuine hometown hospitality. Plains Indians & Pioneers Museum provides visitors with a glimpse of the Wild West history, tales of Temple Houston, and the colorful characters that settled this region. Crystal Beach Park includes a spring fed lake stocked with fish, aquatic center, indoor & outdoor sports facilities, and more. The outdoor coliseum is home to the Elk's Rodeo, which began in 1929. During the holidays, the park turns into "Crystal Christmas" a drive-thru light show. Woodward has a variety of hotels with a range of amenities and facilities. The local restaurants offer a variety of dining options and there are retail shops to explore.



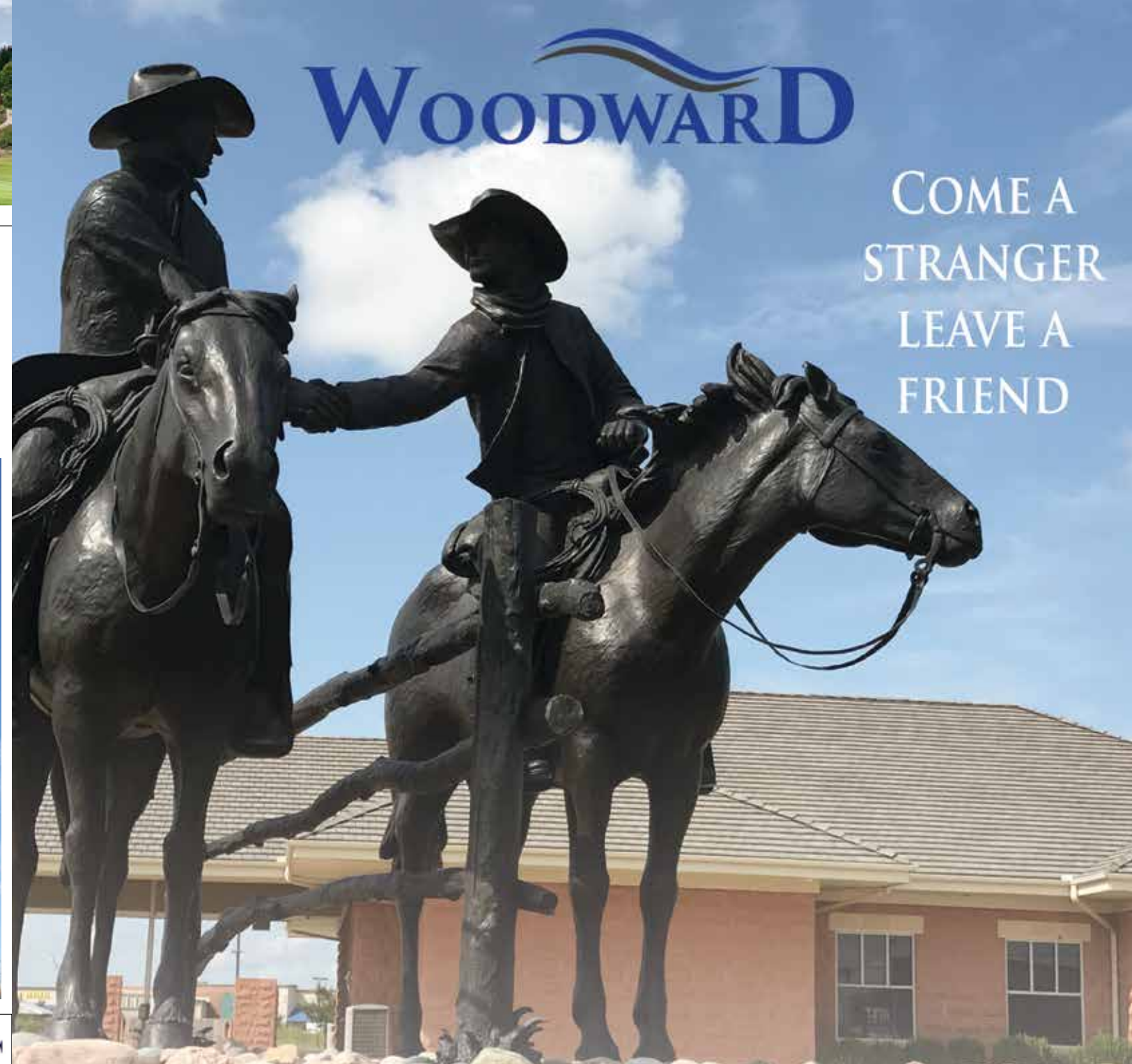

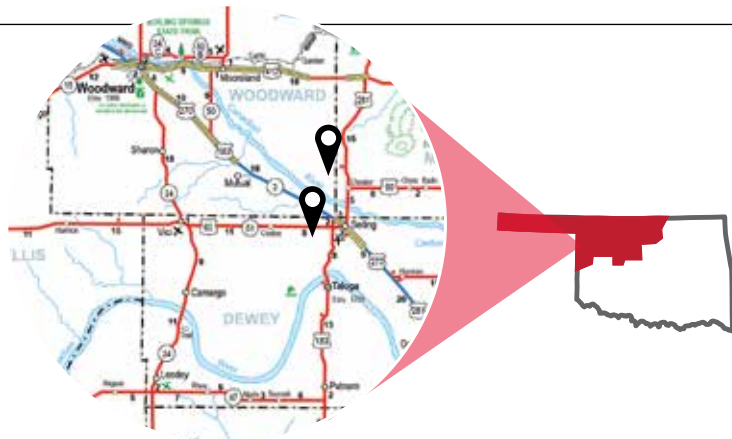

WATONGA (Blaine County)

The Gateway to Roman Nose State Park, Watonga is 70 miles northwest of Oklahoma City, an easy destination trip. Visitors to Watonga can browse through the shops and sample wine produced from locally-grown grapes at Whirlwind Winery. Watonga continues to host the Watonga Cheese Festival in October and several of the local merchants sell Watonga Cheese.

Watonga, the Blaine County seat, has attractions for history buffs and outdoor enthusiasts. Visit the T.B. Ferguson Home & Museum for guided tours, stop by the Ferguson Presbyterian Chapel, built in 1901. The Noble House Bed & Breakfast is listed on the National Registry of Historical Buildings and is one of the lodging options in the area.

Roman Nose State Park was built by the Civilian Conservation Corps in the early 1930's and is one of the original Oklahoma state parks. The park offers activities for all ages, including hiking, mountain biking, and horse trails with beautiful canyon views and flowing cold spring waters. Enjoy swimming, fishing, and a challenging 18-hole golf course. The park's lodge has 22-rooms and a restaurant, or enjoy camping and RV hook-ups. For a unique experience, rent a tepee for the night.

Watonga and Roman Nose State Park host several events, including two Roman Nose Trail Rides, an annual Trout Derby, Oklahoma House Concerts, and live performances at Liberty Theatre.

Don't miss the Seiling Rodeo & Parade in August, "Sprint Thru the Crossroad" Family Fun Run, 5K & 10K Run in September, and Christmas Parade & Holiday Craft Show in December.

In the early 1900's famed prohibitionist Carrie Nation lived in the town. Seiling is the hometown of meteorologist, Gary England.

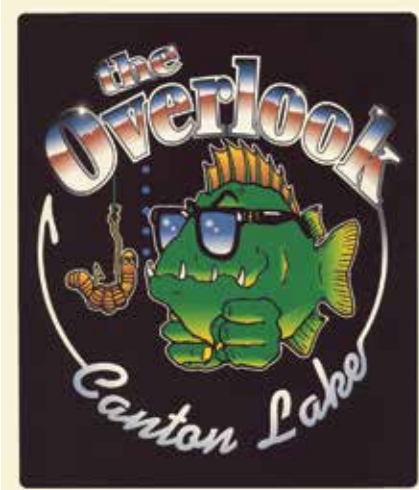

great dining, motel service, RV hookups, bait and tackle shops, and if you're feeling lucky, a nearby casino.

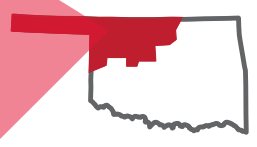

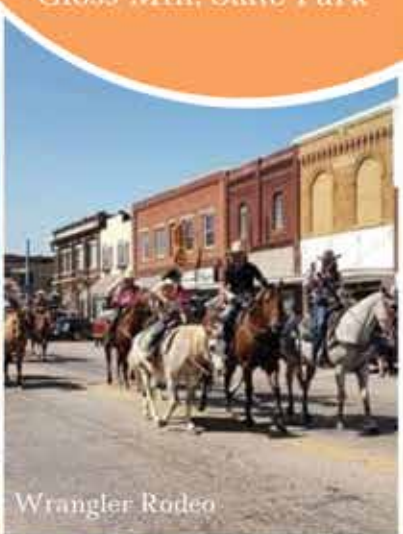

WAYNOKA (Woods County)

Waynoka is known as the Little City by the Sand. People from all over the USA and many foreign countries come to play in our sandbox! Little Sahara State Park is nearly 2,000 acres of living sand dunes. It is among the most popular sand dune parks in the nation, open 24 hours a day, seven days a week. Camping has been made easier with online reservations at the park. Find camping information for Little Sahara State Park at travelok.com. There are multiple private campgrounds located adjacent to the park and in Waynoka, as well as a motel and week-end rentals for those who want more comfort than camping allows. You can ride your ATV or ORV on our trail to town and park on the street in front of your favorite store or eating establishment, get your fuel, riding accessories, or camping supplies for the weekend; it's all available right in Waynoka.

But wait, we're known for our rattlesnakes, too! The Annual Rattlesnake Roundup happens the first weekend after Easter. During this annual event our town grows by 10-20 times our usual population. Hunters bring in the snakes during the weekend and visitors can brave the Den of Death to get a close-up view. The butcher shop will be open, and yes, you can taste snake meat. There are carnival rides, food and merchandise

vendors line the streets. An area ABATE Chapter hosts a Biker Rodeo on Saturday at our rodeo grounds. Snakes are measured and prizes awarded on Sunday afternoon to complete the weekend. This three-day event has something for everyone!

We're also known for the Cimarron River Stampede Rodeo, the oldest ongoing rodeo in the area. Sanctioned by UPRA, KPRA, IPRA & open rodeo associations, this event is held the second weekend in August and attracts some of the best rodeo cowboys and was ranked in 2016 by UPRA at #1 nationally for highest paying added money. Thursday night is kid's night, with special events and activities just for them. You'll enjoy the special performances nightly. Food vendors are on sight at the rodeo grounds with specialties like meatloaf burgers and chicken fry sandwiches. Bring your appetite and your enthusiasm and enjoy three great nights of rodeo at its finest.

One of our historical treasures, the Depot, stands next to one of America's fastest and busiest rail lines, the BNSF Transcon. The Waynoka Air Rail Museum showcases Waynoka transportation history on the second floor of the Harvey House. Both the Harvey House and Santa Fe Depot are listed on the National Register of Historic Places. Train



watching abounds in Waynoka. Just south of Waynoka, a blacktop road leads out to the countryside where the scenic vistas show off beautiful sun rises and sunsets. It's no wonder that Charles Lindbergh and Amelia Earhart found Waynoka such a charming place to visit!

ALVA (Woods County)

Alva was established in 1893 as a land office from the Cherokee Outlet Land Run, the largest of the land rushes in Oklahoma. The town is location on the Atchison, Topeka & Santa Fe Railway.

The Cherokee Strip Museum of Alva is located in the former Alva General Hospital. Upon visiting the Museum, you will find many authentic historical items displayed in one of the 40 rooms throughout the building. Local families whose ancestors have settled in Woods County at the time of the 1893 land run are striving to see that history is preserved. The museum has artifacts from the German POW camp stationed in Alva during World War II. An authentic one room school house is located on the museum complex. The newly renovated country church is available for weddings and events.

In 1897, Alva became home to Northwestern Oklahoma State University. The college's main building for a time was the "Castle on the Hill," a huge, fanciful brick building that towered over much of the town. The Castle burned down in 1935, to be replaced by Jesse Dunn Hall, which was

dedicated in 1937 by Eleanor Roosevelt. The Alva Mural Society is proud of the outstanding historical murals, including the storied Castle and dozens of marvelous murals can be found throughout the town. The Runnymede has an interesting history and provides a community room with a full kitchen. The Alva Community Theatre, (ACT 1) offers live entertainment. Alva hosts a First Friday Art Walk each month in the Arts & Shopping District. The Nescatunga Arts Festival is in June and the RACE Big Cruise & Car Show is in September.

FUN FACTS

Alva is the home of Nancy Denner, Miss America 1957.

A German POW camp drop station was in Alva during World War II.

FREEDOM (Woods County)

The more adventurous can go spelunking throughout the cave system; however, for the more down-to-earth visitor a network of stairs, handrails and well-carved pathways allow you to experience the magnificence and majesty of this cave system.

In Freedom you can explore the Freedom Museum and the Cimarron Cowboys monument in City Park.

Take your picture in front of the Freedom Jail.

Don't miss the Freedom Rodeo & Old Cowhand event. If you are looking for lodging, "The Stables" is a great get-away location. It is located at the entrance of the Alabaster Caverns State Park and is home to Jerry Nelson's Frontier Rodeo Co.

CHEROKEE (Alfalfa County)

The Selenite Crystal Dig, at the Salt Plains National Wildlife Refuge, is open between April 15th and October 1st each year. This area offers bird watching and chance of a lifetime to dig for one-of-a-kind fragile hour-glass crystals that challenge even the most experienced digger.

The 4th of July Celebration offers old fashion fun with food, games, train rides, swimming and more. At nightfall, the celebration continues at the Alfalfa County Fairgrounds with a beautiful fireworks display.

Put on your boots and hat for The

Great Salt Plains Stampede Rodeo & Parade. The event provides cutting, barrel racing, and of course bronc riding from exceptional cowboys and cowgirls. The October Stroll is a wonderful experience for all ages. In December, the Christmas celebration and Lighted Christmas Parade brings lights, food, prizes, and of course, a visit from Santa.

ALINE (Alfalfa County)

One of the highlights of Aline is its traditional Fall Fair dating back to just after WWII. The celebration kicks off Friday evening with cannon firing bowling balls while visitors enjoy homemade cake and ice cream. Saturday morning's parade is led by the motorcycle poker run. Visitors can enjoy soup cooked over an open fire in case iron kettles.

Between Aline and Cleo Springs is a unique attraction that you don't want to miss. At one time there were thousands of sod houses dotting the plains of North America. Marshall McCully's "Soddy", built in 1894, features two rooms constructed from a half acre of thick buffalo grass sod. The inside walls are plastered with alkali clay. A wood floor was added in 1985. Today the museum encloses the original Sod House and a root cellar.

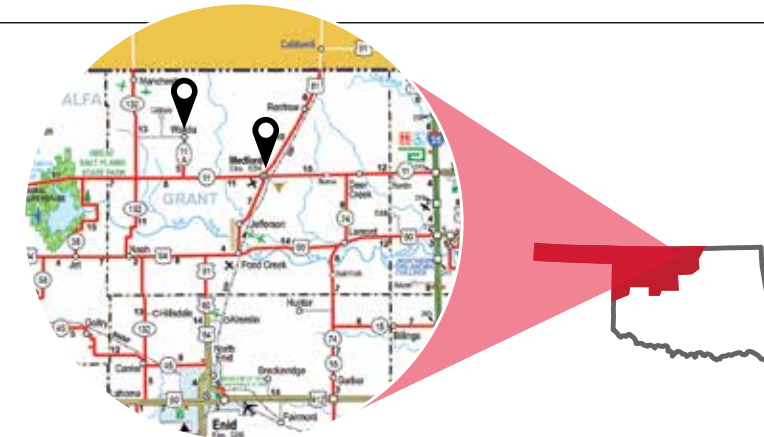


■ MEDFORD (Grant County)

Medford is located in north-central Oklahoma, north of Enid and west of Ponca City. Early cattle trails in the county included Black Dog and the historic Chisholm Trail. The newly opened 1893 Land Run Museum & Community Center houses artifacts related to Medford's agricultural and local history, artfully arranged and labeled. ■ WAKITA (Grant County)

Founded in 1893 following the Land Run in Cherokee Outlet as small farming community, Wakita took off as one of Oklahoma's roadside attractions after landing a leading role in the movie Twister. Transformed into a working movie set for the 1996 blockbuster action movie, Twister, Wakita is home to the Twister (The Movie) Museum. Many of the movie scenes were shot in Wakita. A visit to the Twister Museum provides a first-hand feel for the adventure. Even if it isn't "on the way" the Twister (The Movie) Museum is worth the look!

The Twister (The Movie) Museum will celebrate the 25th Anniversary on May 15th, 2021. The Old Settlers Celebration will be September 18, 2021.

ENID (Garfield County)

The arts and history blend together in Enid, Red Carpet Country's largest city. Home to one of only seven Certified Cultural Districts in Oklahoma.

Enid's walkable Arts and Entertainment District includes the historic downtown square, two square blocks full of boutique and antique shopping, some of Enid's finest cuisine, public art murals & sculptures, and a First Friday event April through October filled with live music, creative artists and themed activities.

The Enid Symphony Orchestra, Oklahoma's longest-running symphony since 1905, lives here, as does the Gaslight Theatre, one of the state's most active community theatres and a free Shakespeare in the Park each summer. Stride Bank Center is the region's top entertainment venue having hosted concerts by music superstars including Alabama, Casting Crowns, Kansas, Mannheim Steamroller, Reba, Willie Nelson, and ZZ Top. Across the street is David Allen Memorial Ballpark, home to the NJCAA Division II World Series and over 270 events per year.

Over 150 year ago, the natural springs at Government Springs Park was known as a popular water stop for cattle along the historic Chisholm Trail. When you see painted hoof prints on Enid's city streets, you are on the Chisholm Trail. Enid was the site of one of four land offices for the Cherokee Strip Land Run on Sept. 16, 1893, the most competitive event in U.S. history when 100,000 land-hungry settlers charged into the Cherokee Outlet for 40,000 plots of land with dreams of claiming their land and start new lives. A visit to the Cherokee Strip Regional Heritage Center reveals a Smithsonian-quality facility that tells the settlers' story in a way that puts you right in the saddle astride your galloping horse toward the Land Run office. You'll also step inside the only remaining original Land Run office from any of Oklahoma's seven land runs.

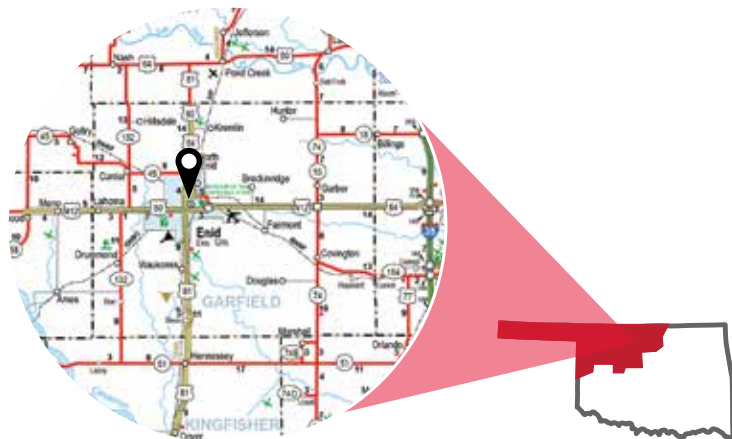
The Dillingham Garden is beautiful

any time of the year and a prime landing spot for monarch butterflies. For family fun, Leonardo's Children's Museum has a two-story indoor Power Tower, and Adventure Quest has a three-story outdoor playground. Train enthusiasts will love the Railroad Museum of Oklahoma, with over a million pieces of railroad memorabilia and a yard filled with engines, cabooses, dining cars and more to explore. Woodring Airport is home to Oklahoma's official Vietnam War Memorial, an 80-percent replica of the Vietnam Wall in Washington, D.C., The Wall of Honor, and ML Becker Learning Center.

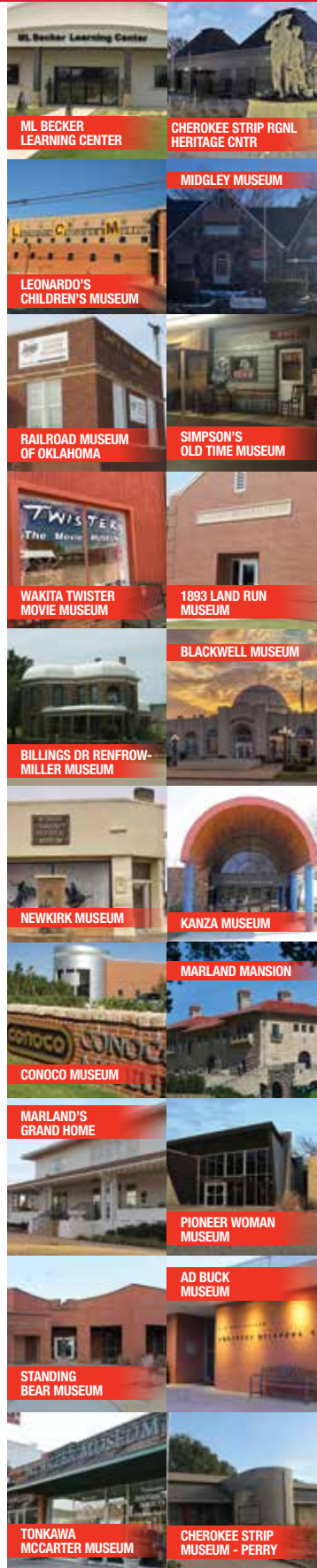

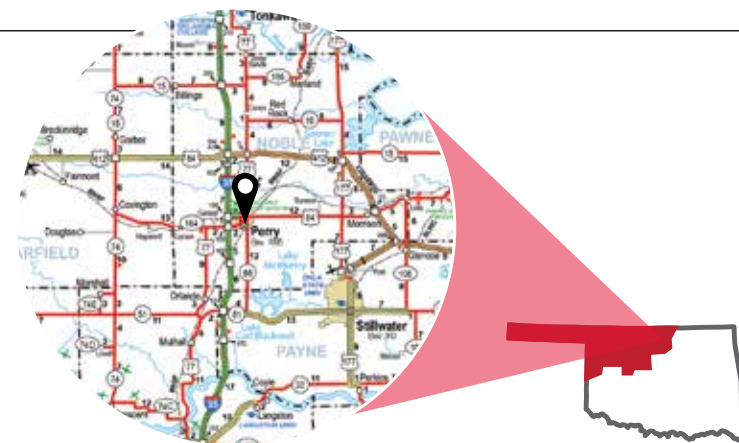

■ PERRY (Noble County)

Established after the Cherokee Outlet
Land Run of 1893, Perry is located along
I-35, less than an hour north of Oklahoma
City. This county seat features a beautiful
courthouse in the middle of the historic
downtown square and is home to several
community events including the Spring
Festival Car & Motorcycle Show and the
Cherokee Strip Celebration. In its early
days, Perry sported 110 saloons and
gambling houses and was home to the
notorious Doolin Gang. Today, the town
is proud of its agricultural history,
progressive businesses, and
home-town values.

Just off I-35 you will find the Cherokee
Strip Museum complex with outdoor
exhibits, a new blacksmith shop, shaded
picnic areas and bridge, the Rose Hill
one-room schoolhouse, and a museum
that displays the history of the Cherokee
Outlet. While in town, take time to stroll
downtown, stop at a variety of shops,
and eat at one of the local
hometown restaurants.

■ BLACKWELL (Kay County)

This small-town packs a big punch! Surrounded by five casinos, Blackwell also plays host to a thriving event center for circuses, drone races, rodeos and barn quilt trails. This charming town is also home to the largest county fair in the state, taking place the first full week in September of every year. With an economy that has been based in agriculture and the oil and gas industry, during the 1930s through the 1960s, Blackwell ranked only behind Oklahoma City and Tulsa in Oklahoma for

the number of jobs in its industrial and manufacturing sectors. Companies that have operated in Blackwell include Blackwell Zinc Smelter, Blackwell Milling and Elevator Co., Blackwell Ice Company, Consolidated Gas Co., and Hazel-Atlas Gas. Blackwell has become home to textile research, development and manufacturing, investment casting, high tech manufacturing, and oil and gas service and distribution firms. While in town, stop in and visit the Top of the Oklahoma Museum!

■ NEWKIRK (Kay County)

The northern gateway to beautiful Kaw Lake. The entire downtown is on the National Register with the largest collection of limestone buildings in the state of Oklahoma. Newkirk has the only courthouse in Oklahoma paid for before construction began. Main Street is on historic Highway 77, built at the same time as Route 66.

Newkirk is the home to the county

seat; and of Good Luck Liniment, patented in the late 1890's by Charlie Adams, an early day pharmacist. The liniment was designed to treat livestock for cuts and saddle sores and is still made and sold in Newkirk today.

Plan a Road Trip to Newkirk, on the second Saturday in September, for the Charlie Adams Day which honor's Newkirk's heritage and Good Luck. The

event takes place on the courthouse lawn and features world-class barbecue, Dutch oven cooking, storytelling, great entertainment, and activities for kids.

Newkirk offers comfortable lodging, great restaurants, Historic Business District, golfing, swimming, gaming and friendly people.

■ TONKAWA (Kay County)

Native Americans, hardy pioneers, educators, oilmen, German prisoners of war and creative citizens have all left their mark on this city on the Salt Fork River. Tonkawa (the word translates as "they all stay together") takes its name from the Tonkawa Tribe. Because of abundant wheat production in the area, Tonkawa styles itself the "Wheatheart of Oklahoma." The picturesque Heart in the Park Labyrinth with its timeline

of Tonkawa history and the Grand Heart Walk of art panels surrounded by personalized pavers are the latest additions to Centennial Park. A number of historical monuments and three museums - the McCarter Museum of Tonkawa History, the Tonkawa Tribal Museum and the A.D. Buck History and Welcome Center - give glimpses of the history of the Tonkawa.

Tonkawa was the site of a POW camp during World War II that housed over 3,000 prisoners and Army personnel.



■ PONCA CITY (Kay County)

Ponca City thrives on its rich history, diversity attractions and elegant architecture. In 1914, oil baron E.W. Marland began construction on his first home. The now restored 22 room mansion was designed with ground breaking amenities, including Oklahoma's first indoor swimming pool. Marland's Grand Home showcases his family, 1920's oil empire and Native American artifacts from area tribes. The 101 Ranch Museum is located in the home.

Modeled after the Davanzati Palace in Florence, Italy, the E.W. Marland Estate, a 55 room 43,000 square foot "castle on the prairie," contains a leather-lined elevator, 12 bathrooms, 3 kitchens, 7 fireplaces and an elegant ballroom with a 24-karat gold leaf covered ceiling worth over \$2 million. This 1928 home is now listed as a National Historic Landmark. The Marland Oil Company merged with Isaac Blake's Continental Oil & Transportation to become Conoco, a 20th century energy company like no other.

Opening is 1927, the Poncan Theatre enjoyed the "golden era" of cinema. The Poncan is home to a large collection of hand-painted movie posters from the 1920's & 1930's,

all original to the theatre.

The two tallest bronze statues in the state of Oklahoma live in Ponca City. The 30-foot "Confident" Pioneer Woman is located in front of the Pioneer Woman Museum, where you can discover stories of Oklahoma's pioneer women. "Confident" was chosen by a vote from 750,000 people from across the USA. The Standing Bear Museum is home of the 22-foot Poncan Chief Standing Bear. The museum displays artifacts from the Kaw, Osage, Otoe-Missouria, Pawnee, Ponca and Tonkawa tribes. The annual Standing Bear Pow Wow is held at their permanent arbor each September.

Ponca City hosts many events, such as the Herb Festival, Cruisin' Grand, Cherokee Strip Golf Classic, Fine Arts Festival, BBQ Cook-off, PRCA 101 Wild West Rodeo, Oktoberfest, Holiday Happenings and Festival of Angels.

FUN FACTS

Ernest Whitworth Marland struck oil in June 1911, and the Marland Oil Company was born.

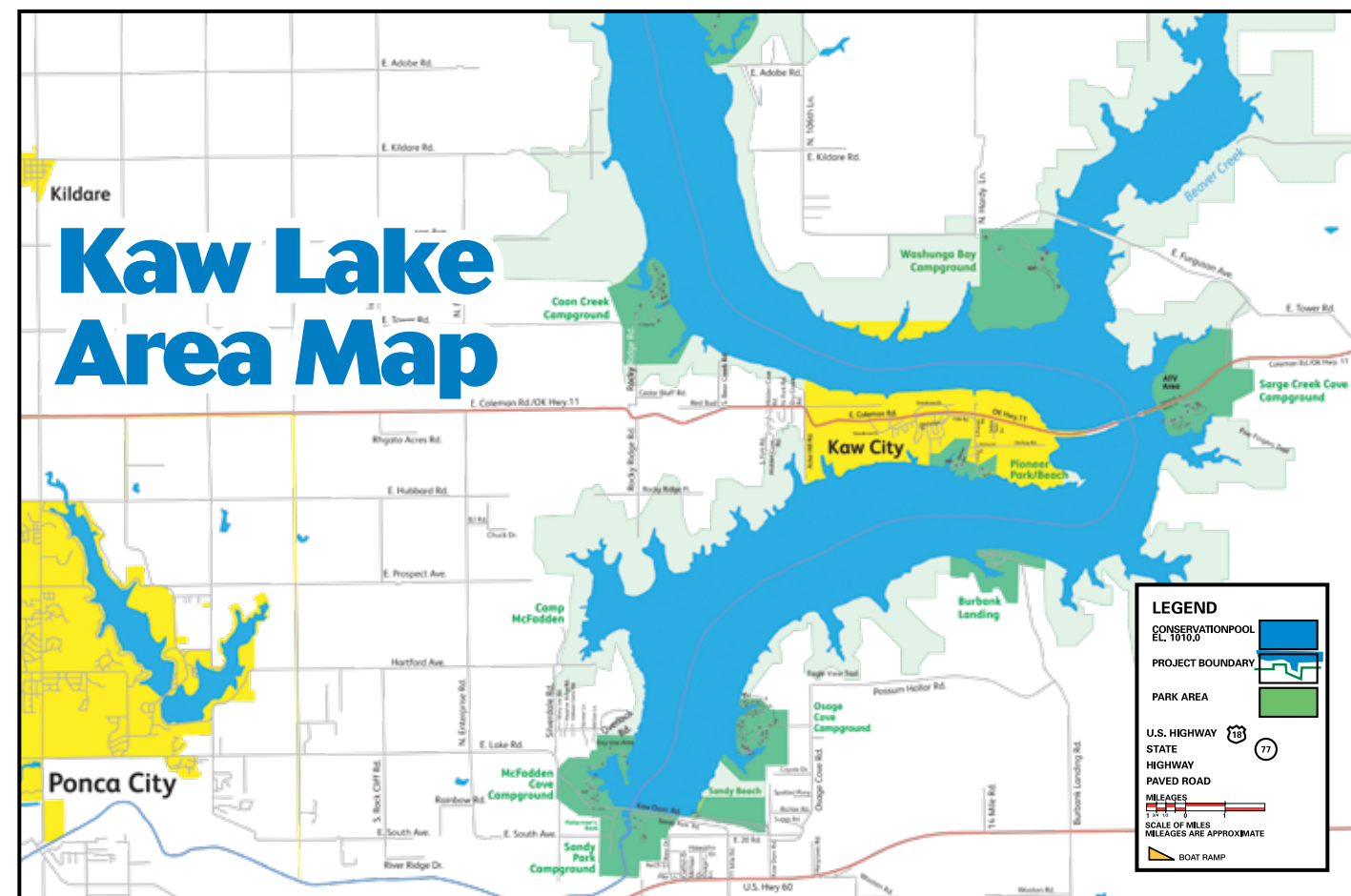

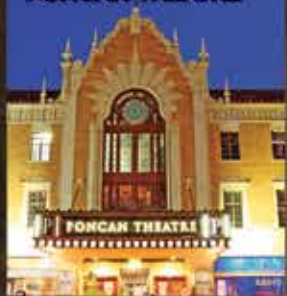
